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Program Improvements

The Department of Graduate Counseling (DOGC) evaluated each outcome for 2018-2019 and identified programmatic improvements for 2019-2020. The following is a description of improvements that will be a focus of the DOGC in 2019-2020:

- Again this year, 12 of the 16 program goals were achieved based on all methods of assessment. The DOGC will continue to strive for standards of excellence across all program goals.
- Employers did not rate alumni as highly as expected on technology skills. Overall, students are actively engaged in technology in the academic program. The faculty determined that the question on technology proficiency is vague and recommended changing the wording to be more specific to determine if alumni are meeting professional expectations. Faculty also discussed reviewing curriculum for opportunities to train students more on professional technology elements such as electronic charting.
- During the 2018-2019 self-study process, the faculty identified new areas for program assessment. For 2019-2020, these new assessments will be utilized and incorporated into the annual program assessment. Students and site supervisors will complete program assessments, an advisory committee of alumni, employers, site supervisors, and current students will make recommendations for program improvements, and students will complete self-assessments of dispositions.
