Proposed program changes 2021-2022

The faculty have reviewed assessment data from 2020-2021 and made recommendations for program changes. The following are proposed changes for the 2021-2022 academic year.

- The Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs) were condensed from 16 to 10 to reflect recommendations from the CACREP site visit to streamline these. These PLOs will be used moving forward.
- Key Performance Indicators were reviewed and new measures were added for Theological Foundations and Marriage and Family Counseling in 2020-2021. Key Performance Indicators have been adjusted to correspond with changes in PLOs.
- Student disposition letters will be sent later in the Spring semester so that Spring session B is included in the review.
- Assessment measures for student dispositions and Key Performance Indicators will be updated with better software tools for 2021-2022.
- Student self-assessments will be revised for spring 2022, particularly for first year students, to make sure that questions are commensurate with their developmental level in the program and to maximize this tool's efficiency.
- Our department goals for passing rates for each individual CPCE section will be adjusted to 85% which is more on target with our overall passing expectations. The goal for all students passing the CPCE final score remains at 90%.
- The program is more diverse demographically. The department will continue to work with admissions on strategies to target more diverse applicants.
- Alumni gatherings will be added for 2021-2022 and faculty and alumni will assess the impact of these events.
